

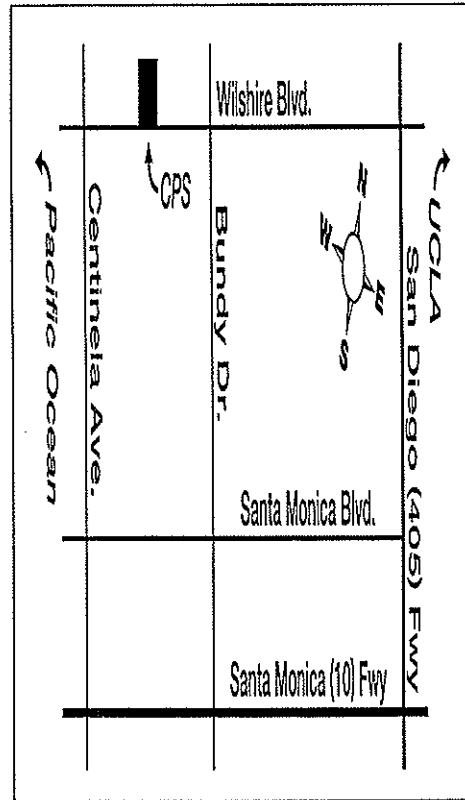
If standard glasses don't solve your vision problems, help is available at **The Center for the Partially Sighted**.

Our **Low Vision Store** offers a selection of items that assist people with impaired vision in their daily activities. If more help is needed, our staff of **low vision specialists** are available by appointment.

The Center is located on the north side of Wilshire between Bundy and Centinela in the Wilshire Pacific Plaza . We can be reached via the 405 (San Diego) or 10 (SM) freeway. **Valet Parking** is available behind the building and there is metered street parking.

Limited **transportation** can be arranged for appointments. Ask for details.

A nonprofit agency

**The Center for the Partially Sighted** is a nonprofit low vision rehabilitation agency for people whose sight is severely limited but who are not totally blind. Our program is designed to help partially sighted people of all ages live, work and play as independently as possible.

The Center is not a surgical treatment facility. We work **with your eye doctor**, providing counseling, rehabilitation training and special low vision aids that improve visual function. When you call the Center for your appointment, please request a referral form so your eye doctor can complete it before your appointment. To schedule an appointment, or for additional information, call 310-458-3501.

**Center services include:**

- **Low Vision Store** offers items for people with impaired sight, including magnification up to 6X
- **Exams** by low vision optometrists who can design and prescribe specialized aids.
- **Training** in the use of prescribed low vision aids
- **Independent Living Skills** –on site or in your home
- **Orientation and Mobility** instruction to help you learn to move around safely
- **Peer Calls** to provide support by phone contact
- **Psychological Counseling** and support groups with professional staff

**For your appointment**, please bring any low vision aids you are now using, such as glasses or magnifiers, and examples of close-up work you would like to do, such as paying bills, reading, or needlework. Allow two hours for your first visit.

**Fees** for optometric care are based on ability to pay. There is **no charge** to our clients for most rehabilitation services.

The Center is a nonprofit agency and a participating provider of **Medicare, Medi-Cal** and the **California Dept. of Rehabilitation**. These programs may cover a portion of the services.
